PLENARY SPEAKERS



Curt Bonk received his master's and Ph.D. degrees in educational psychology from the University of Wisconsin. He is Professor of Instructional Systems Technology in the School of Education at Indiana University and adjunct in the School of Informatics. He has received the CyberStar Award from the Indiana Information Technology Association, the Most Outstanding Achievement Award from the U.S. Distance Learning Association, and the Most Innovative Teaching in a Distance Education Program Award from the State of Indiana. Curt has given more than 800 talks around the globe related to

online teaching and learning. In addition, he has written over 200 publications on topics such as online learning pedagogy, massive multiplayer online gaming, Wikibooks, blogging, open source software, collaborative technologies, and synchronous and asynchronous computer conferencing. He is author of the *Handbook of Blended Learning: Global Perspectives, Local Designs* (2006) as well as *Empowering Online Learning: 100+ Activities for Reading, Reflecting, Displaying, and Doing* (2008). Curt is President of CourseShare and SurveyShare (see http://mypage.iu.edu/~cjbonk/; email: cjbonk@indiana.edu).

Adam Samhouri received his undergraduate degree in Civil Engineering from Brigham Young University and his MS in Instructional Technology from Utah State University. He has worked with several professional companies as a Lead Instructional Designer or as a Project Manager. He worked for the USAF, Ameritech Library Services, Arthur Andersen, MicroStrategy, Jones International University, University of Phoenix, and as an independent Education Consultant. Certified as a Project Management Professional (PMP*) with PMI, Adam applies the project management methodologies in the design, development, and implementation of educational and training programs. Adam currently serves as Associate Director of Partnership Services (Online Curriculum Design and Management) for New Ventures of Regis University.

SMALL GROUP FACILITATORS

Lisa M. Bunkowski is an assistant professor of History at Park University and is currently on academic release as an instructor evaluator and lead mentor for Park University's College for Distance Learning. She recently developed and now oversees Park University's Online Instructor Mentoring Program. Bunkowski earned her PhD in History from the University of Kansas, an MA in History and a BA in Spanish, cum laude, from Emporia State University. Her current areas of historical research include violence, vigilantism and community in the mid-19th century American borderlands. She is actively engaged in developing strategies for building community in the online classroom, and improving online and blended teaching and learning. She is a course developer, and is involved in developing new programs for the College for Distance Learning. She was named the 2007-08 Outstanding Faculty Member of the College for Distance Learning, School for Online Learning.

Carrie E. Buri is the Center Director of Concordia University Wisconsin's School of Adult Education in Madison, Wisconsin. Since 2002 Ms. Buri has worked in varying capacities supporting Concordia's unique approach to educating the adult learner. In addition, Ms. Buri provides instruction and training to faculty and students on the effective use of online course management systems. She is an adjunct faculty member and teaches undergraduate, graduate, and e-learning courses. Ms. Buri earned a B.A. in Management and Communications and a M.S. Ed. in Counseling at Concordia University Wisconsin. She currently is enrolled at Edgewood College as a dissertator in the Ed. D. degree program in Higher Education Leadership. Buri will defend her research on Adult Student Perceptions of Using an On-line Course Management System as a Supplement to Accelerated Classroom Instruction in May 2008.

Marti Garlett earned her Ph.D. in Higher Education Leadership from Claremont Graduate University and her master's in literacy development from Peabody College of Vanderbilt University. She was the Founding Dean of the Teachers College at Western Governors University and currently serves as Vice President for Academic Programs and Professional Licensure in the Division of Institutional Oversight and Academic Integrity at the Laureate Higher Education Group, which includes Walden University and a large global network of online and on-campus institutions serving 350,000 students annually. Among the innovations Dr. Garlett has brought to Laureate is a successful accelerated hybrid model for post-baccalaureate teacher preparation, approved for licensure by the Minnesota Board of Teaching. Dr. Garlett serves as a board member on the National Council for Teacher Quality, has written three books, and spent nearly a decade as "Miss Marti" on the Romper Room children's television program. She is married to her college sweetheart, long-time CAP member, Dr. Fred Garlett.

Deborah O'Reilly is an Assistant Professor in National-Louis University's Applied Behavioral Sciences Program with interests in group dynamics, adult development, and accelerated learning programs. Deborah is currently Chair of the Department of Social and Behavioral Sciences at the Chicago Campus. She has taught in National-Louis University's adult accelerated programs since 1990 as well as within the psychology program's online delivery. Deborah received an M.B.A from Saint Louis University, an M.A. from Washington University in St. Louis and taken online courses in a doctoral program at California Institute of Integral Studies in San Francisco, CA.

Ellen Waterman is the Associate Dean for Distance Education at Regis University. Her division in the College for Professional Studies works with faculty to design and develop courses for online delivery, and is now working to develop pedagogical guidelines and support for students and faculty working in all technology-enhanced learning formats. She is a frequent presenter at international conferences focused on new approaches to teaching and learning with technology, and has been published internationally. She is an active member of the Association of Jesuit Colleges and Universities Deans of Adult and Continuing Education, and is currently working on an international Jesuit initiative to explore enabling online learning for poor and disenfranchised people across the world.



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
